

WHAT'S THAT SOUND?

Learning Level Early (aged 3 years to P1)
Time 2 hours

The What's that Sound programme leads the class through an exciting underwater world, discovering hundreds of different animals and exploring the variety of noises found in the marine environment. Children will take part in a guided 'Sound' trail and get hands on with some hardy seashore critters. The class will finally settle down for an interactive sound workshop with the impressive backdrop of the aquarium's kelp reef.

Concepts

The marine environment can be explored using our senses.
Plants and animals are living things which are treated with respect and care.
Living things have features that make them unique and can use sounds in a variety of ways.
Sound is a vibration and travels through water and air.
