Time 2 hours

Plastics are part of our everyday lives, but when they get into the ocean they become a persistent problem with far reaching impacts. This workshop explores the types and sources of plastic waste typically found at the beach, the impacts that this waste has on ocean life and what we can do to help.

Activities

A guided tour of the aquarium

Handling live marine animals

Interactive plastics workshop including extraction of microplastics from sands.

Key Concepts

Plastics (derived from petroleum) are persistent in the environment and harm marine life.

Reducing plastic waste and correct disposal of plastic is vitally important to protecting the marine environment.
